## NGN and you in 2016

Throughout 2016 we have been working to make it as easy as possible for you to help shape what we do, and how we do it. It's been a really busy year and we can't thank you enough for your input in terms of feedback but also, for working with us to deliver joint solutions to our shared challenges.

There have been many and varied highlights for us throughout the year but we wanted to share just a few of them with you as we start looking ahead to 2017.

We are always looking for new ways to talk to local communities about our work and how we can work more closely with them. In early 2016 we held our **Depot Days**, opening our doors to everyone in our communities to come and see what we do first-hand. These interactive sessions saw everyone from councillors to local schools and charities seeing our work up close. We received some great feedback and we're looking forward to opening our doors again next year.

It has been a big year for us raising awareness of the role of gas in Energy Futures; Energy Minister, Andrea Leadsom attended our **Energising the North** event in Leeds in March. We also launched **H21 City Gate**, our ambitious plans to convert significant parts of the UK gas grid to be 100% hydrogen, over the summer. We think the message is getting through and we're delighted that the Energy and Climate Change Committee recognised Hydrogen as a potential solution to explore in the future of heat debate.

In July we published our **2016 Stakeholder Report** outlining our performance for the previous year and bringing it to life through case studies. If you're yet to see the report or visit our website please do, and be sure to share your views with us - they really do matter.

We rounded off the year by announcing the successful projects for our **Community Promises Fund**. The Fund supports projects and initiatives which aim to help alleviate hardship and other challenges associated with fuel poverty, educate around environmental energy efficiency ideas, raise awareness of the dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning and

## Ready for Winter

Following the floods in Winter 2015/16 we also developed an £11 million investment programme to assess all our pipe bridges over rivers and strengthen them where required to ensure resilience during future storms.
